5th International Symposium

IACSS and CACSS, the Croatian Association on Computer Science in Sport, organized the 5th International Symposium on *Computer Science in Sport* in Hvar, Croatia, between 25 and 28 May, 2005.

Delegates from 18 nations participated in this successful and perfectly organized event.

IACSS thanks Leo Pavičić (University of Zagreb), chairman of the organizing committee, for a stimulating scientific and an impressive social program.

11 invited keynote and plenary lectures were presented, 33 oral presentations were given and 10 posters were displayed.

Keynote speakers were Professor Larry Katz (University of Calgary), Prof. Tom Reilly (Liverpool John Moores University), Boris Sakac (Head of the Olympic Results and Information System), Prof. Wolfgang Schöllhorn (University of Münster) and Prof. Otto Spaniol (RWTH Aachen University).

Two round table sessions were included in the scientific program. The topic of the first was "Computer science in sport curriculum – University level". Experiences were exchanged, the possibility of joint Master's programs was discussed. Josef Wiemeyer (Darmstadt) and Arnold Baca (Vienna) agreed to go on working in this area and to keep the IACSS community informed. The second round table discussion was on "ICT standard in sport". Keith Lyons (Australian Institute of Sport) and Leo Pavičić moderated the stimulating discussion. It was agreed to continue the discussion using an eMail-group set up by IACSS.

During the General Assembly of IACSS a new Board of Directors was elected for the period 2005-2007:

IACSS thanks Leo Pavičić, Predrag Vujasinović, Dragan Vujović, (Zagreb), Oliver Strubreither (Vienna) as well as Richard M. Levy, Larry Katz and Doug Bowman (Calgary) for this initiative.

Invited lectures and selected oral and poster presentations will be published within IJCSS, the E-Journal of IACSS.

Cooperation agreement with IASI

During the Symposium in Hvar a Statement of Cooperation and formal Letter of Agreement was agreed on between IACSS and IASI, the International Association for Sports Information. The document was signed by the presidents of both organizations, Jürgen Perl (IACSS) and Alain Poncet (IASI).

The main items of the agreement are as follows:

1 - General Goals and Objectives

IASI and IACSS's members have mutually beneficial aims and rationale. Both have a mandate to provide information and serve the educational and research needs of sport organizations, sport administrators, teachers, coaches, and sport science researchers.

IASI and IACSS, in accordance with their respective mandates and principles, would like to build a cooperation, and therefore agree to the following:

2 - Cooperative Activities

- 2.1 IASI and IACSS may decide to build a common Workshop composed by common members of both institutions, in order to improve the quality and the diffusion of sport information in their respective organizations, and particularly regarding the new technologies in Sport science and information.
- 2.2 IASI may decide to invite as an observer a representative of IACSS to the IASI annual meeting of its Executive Committee. Co-operation with IACSS shall be a regular agenda item at this meeting.

- 2.3 IACSS may decide to invite as an observer a representative of IASI to the IACSS biennial statutory meeting. Co-operation with IASI shall be a regular agenda item at this meeting.
- 2.4 IACSS will serve as a consultant to IASI for information related to new technologies in sport and physical education information, particularly in the specific fields of competence of its members.
- 2.5 IASI and IACSS will exchange free copies of their publications (bulletins, newsletters, relevant publications,...) and will establish a permanent link between their respective web sites.
- 2.6 IASI will give, at the demand of IACSS, its patronage to its Congress and vice versa IACSS will give, at the demand of IASI, its patronage to the quadrennial IASI world Congress.
